I am Ready to Go Back to School When I am...

Fever free for 24 hours <u>without</u> the use of fever reducing medications.	Free from vomiting for at least 24 hours or have had 2 solid meals <u>without</u> the use of medications.	Free from diarrhea for at least 24 hours <u>without</u> the use of medications.	Free from rash, itching or fever and evaluated by a doctor if needed.	Treated with appropriate lice treatment at home and seen by the school nurse.	Eye has returned to normal or have a note from the doctor to return to school.	Released by a medical provider to return to school
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- Please keep your student home from school if he/she is too sick to comfortably participate in classroom and other school activities.
- If your child tests positive for COVID-19, please keep him/her home until fever-free for 24 hrs without use of medication and other symptoms have greatly improved or resolved before returning to school. Please take additional precautionary measures for the next 5 days after returning, such as frequent handwashing, masking indoors, distancing, and testing. If a child tests negative, masking is not needed.
- If your child has strep throat or another bacterial infection, he/she should stay home until the antibiotic has been given for at least 24 hours and your health care provider has given permission for your child to return to school.
- When calling the school to report an absence (520-722-8478), please state the nature of your student’s illness so we may better track trends.
