



Marci McLean

Marci McLean has more than 30 years of experience in independent schools having been a parent, volunteer, board member, and administrator. From 1999-2009 Marci was the Director of Admission at Parish Episcopal School in Dallas, Texas. While at Parish she participated in the planning for a grade expansion to add a middle and high school to the existing PreK through 5th through 5th grade program, and then led the effort to increase the school's enrollment from 400 to 1,150 students. From 2009-2019 Marci was the Chief Advancement Officer for Parish with responsibility for admissions, enrollment management, fundraising, communication, and alumni relations. She led two capital campaigns that raised over \$50 million, and oversaw many annual fund campaigns. In 2017 she obtained the CFRE (Certified Fundraising Executive) certification.

Marci has served on several administrative, strategic, and long-range planning committees. She also served on the Board of Trustees of two independent schools. Prior to joining Episcopal, Marci was a practicing attorney and spent the majority of career as Assistant General Counsel for S & A Restaurant Corp., a restaurant chain owning over 300 establishments.
