St. Michael's Summer Book Report Requirements for Sixth Grade

Students must create a book jacket with a front cover, an interior two-page spread, and a back cover. The entire book jacket should be created from a single sheet of folded, white 8 1/2 x 11" paper. The inside spread and back cover text can be either typed and glued, or hand-written in ink.

- **Front Cover:** The front cover is based on **ONE** of the two selected choice books (NOT *Holes*). It must include title, author, and the student's name, as well as one original color drawing of a significant scene **and** one significant quotation from the book.
- **Inside Spread:** Inside the book jacket, you will write **two** paragraphs (at least **8** sentences each) on **ONE** main character in *Holes*. Before you start writing, make a list of character traits that describe this character. Choose what you think are the two most important traits that describe the character and write one paragraph about each trait. Give an example of when this character exhibited each trait. Explain how this character's personality affected other characters in the book or moved the action of the story forward.
- **Back Cover:** The back cover must include an **8-10 sentence** personal response to the **OTHER** selected book: How does this book compare to other books you've read in the same genre? Did the characters appeal to you? Did you relate personally to any of the characters or events? Why did or didn't you enjoy the book?
